  - a. By making these calls we were able to significantly increase our voters to Perm Ballot status, ensuring our local voters will receive their Absentee Voter Ballots for all future elections held at Dexter Township.

### DISCUSSION ITEMS:

The Clerk's office submitted our ballot order for May 6, 2025, Dexter Community Schools Bond Millage, which will be a special election. Dexter Township will host both Precinct #1 and Precinct #3D at the Dexter Township Hall location. Precinct #1 has a total of 2,366 registered voters and Precinct #3D has a total of 831 registered voters. The consensus of the Washtenaw Clerk's agreed that we would forgo offering 9-day early voting which would save the school and taxpayers funds. Dexter Community Schools will be responsible for the reimbursement of all the municipality's costs to open and run the precincts to host the election that fall in the Dexter Community Schools District.

Dear Voter:

Dexter Township is discontinuing our Permanent Absent Voter Application List. Beginning with the next election, we will no longer be sending AV Ballot Applications to you automatically before every election.

Instead, state law gives you the option to join the Permanent Mail Ballot List and receive an AV ballot for every future election that you are eligible to vote in. If you join this list, you won't need to apply for a ballot for each election – it will be sent to you automatically.

If you want to vote an AV ballot in an election, you can submit an AV ballot application in any of the following ways:

- Request your clerk mail you an AV ballot application or download an AV ballot application from [Michigan.gov/Elections](http://Michigan.gov/Elections), and return it by mail, email, or in-person
- Submit an online AV ballot application at [Michigan.gov/Vote](http://Michigan.gov/Vote)
- Join the Permanent Mail Ballot List by marking the box on an AV ballot application "I want to vote absentee in all future elections. Automatically send me an absent voter ballot for every election."

Also, please update us whenever your mailing address changes so you don't get removed from the permanent ballot list. If we mail you a ballot and it gets returned to us as undeliverable, we automatically remove you from the permanent ballot list and you will need to re-join.

For voters who spend significant time away from their registration address (snowbirds, college students, etc.), your AV ballot will be mailed to your voter registration address or primary mailing address listed in our system unless you notify us of a new mailing address prior to each election. Your ballot will not be forwarded, so update your mailing address before you travel.

**Dexter Community Schools School Improvement Bond Proposition**

Shall the Dexter Community Schools, Counties of Washtenaw and Livingston, State of Michigan, borrow the principal sum of not to exceed Two Hundred Forty-One Million Eight Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$241,865,000) and issue its unlimited tax general obligation bonds, in one or more series, to pay the cost of the following projects to create a modern learning environment for students and for health, safety, security, energy conservation and other purposes:

Erecting additions to school buildings and other facilities and remodeling, equipping and reequipping, furnishing and refurbishing school buildings, additions, playgrounds, athletic fields and facilities and other facilities, including for secure entryways, modernizing instructional, fine arts, theater, music, weight and fitness spaces;

Erecting, equipping and furnishing school facilities, athletic and other facilities, including for an indoor athletic facility and maintenance building;

Acquiring, preparing, developing and improving sites for school buildings, including athletic fields, playgrounds and other facilities and the purchase of school buses;

Acquiring and installing technology equipment and technology infrastructure, in school buildings and other facilities?

The annual debt millage required to retire all bonds of the School District currently outstanding and proposed pursuant to this ballot is expected to remain at or below 8.5 mills which is an estimated -0- mill increase from the debt millage levied in 2024. The estimated millage that will be levied to pay the proposed bonds in the first year is 1.55 mills (\$1.55 per \$1,000 of taxable value) and the estimated simple average annual millage that will be required to retire each series of the bonds is 4.18 mills annually (\$4.18 per \$1,000 of taxable value). The maximum number of years the bonds may be outstanding, exclusive of refunding, is not more than thirty (30) years.

If approved by the voters, the repayment of the bonds will be guaranteed by the State under the School Bond Qualification and Loan Program (the "Program"). The School District currently has \$77,320,000 of qualified bonds outstanding and \$651,119 of qualified loans outstanding under the Program. The School District expects to borrow from the Program to pay debt service on these bonds. The estimated total principal amount of the additional borrowing is \$6,687,504 and the estimated total interest thereon is \$1,686,616. The estimated duration of the millage levy associated with that borrowing is 9 years. The estimated computed millage rate required to be levied to pay the proposed bonds may change in the future based on changes in certain circumstances.
